UNIMIC save lives after car accident in Centland

During an air patrol by helicopter, carried out by UNIMIC observers of Sector South on Monday July 1st, several cease fire violations were observed, in and along the area of separation.

Militia, who pointed stingers at the UN helicopter, forced the pilot to push the limits with extreme maneuvers in order to bring the patrol into safety.

The UNIMIC observers also noticed

mortars and a possible execution.

Force Commander Middleton: "It is intolerable that UN helicopters are targeted, since the UN is in the area to facilitate peace between the warring factions. UNIMIC observers should never be a target."



UN chief welcomes possibility of resumed talks between US and North Korea



As the clicking of cameras and flash of lightbulbs captured on Sunday the first sitting United States President to set foot inside North Korea, Secretary-General António Guterres offered his full support to a potentially reset relationship that may render a denuclearized Korean Peninsula.

The UN chief “welcomes the meetings in Panmunjom involving the leaders of the Democratic People’s Republic of Korea (DPRK), the Republic of Korea and the United States”, his spokesperson said in a statement, adding “particularly the announcement that the DPRK and the United States will resume working-level dialogue”.

For the first time since their last summit in the Vietnamese capital, Hanoi, broke down in February, both

countries agreed to resume stalled nuclear talks.

Before crossing over, US President Donald Trump and North Korean leader Kim Jong-un posed for photographers in the heavily-fortified demilitarized zone.

“The Secretary-General fully supports the continued efforts of the parties to establish new relations towards sustainable peace, security and complete and verifiable denuclearization of the Korean Peninsula”, according to the statement.

Nuclear negotiations between the US and North Korea have proceeded in fits and starts for decades, with no sustaining success in halting the North’s atomic weapons programme.

In 2017, Pyongyang launched its sixth and largest nuclear test since it began its programme in 2006, strai-

ning further US-North Korean relations during President Trump’s first year in office.

The following year, Mr. Trump and Mr. Kim met in Singapore, signing a joint statement vowing to pursue peace and complete denuclearization of the Korean Peninsula, albeit with few details.

The two met again in February 2018, but disagreements over sanction and denuclearization collapse the summit early, yielding no agreement.

Car accident in the western part of Centland



A serious traffic accident occurred on the road between Wangen and Heimenkirch in vicinity of the village Maria Thann Monday July 1st at 09:30.

An UNIMIC truck crashed into a Renault Megane with a family from Lindenberg on board.

The occupants of the two vehicles were seriously injured.

The driver of the Renault, a 41-year-old father died on the way to the hospital due to serious internal injuries. A passing patrol of UNIMIC observers provid-

ed immediate first aid, blocking the scene of the accident and preventing further miseries. As the head doctor of the hospital reports, it is thanks to the rapid professional help of the UNIMIC observers that there are no further deaths to be complained of. The cause of the accident is still unclear.
